Throughout his career as a social documentary photographer, Lewis W. Hine sought not only to provide evidence of inferior living and working conditions, but also to portray America's working people with dignity and compassion. This is especially evident in his work for the National Child Labor Committee. The significance of these photographs lies not only in their power to inform us, but also to move us. Hine's photographs of child exploitation led to the passing of child labor laws. With millions of children working today in sub-human and illegal conditions, we are especially proud to remind the public-at-large of the importance of these compelling photographs by Lewis Hine, a true American hero.

ABELARDO MORELL: MAPS AND BOOKS (Working Title) Oct. 17 - Nov. 30

For "Maps and Books," we will be showing work made within the last two years by Abelardo Morell. Included in this exhibition will be a series of photographs of ordinary, store-bought maps that take on a surreal quality with an original and abstract vision. Also in the show will be new photographs of historical art books made at the Boston Athenaeum. These works transform, through the most straightforward means, the simplicity of printed books into illusionistic depictions of the art of the past.
